I ask questions and wonder.

I am fully engaged in all my learning.

I listen to ideas and opinions of others.



Initiative & Independence

I approach problems confidently and positively.

I can choose and use the resources I need.

I can take responsibility for my own learning.

I can take responsibility for my behaviour.

I am motivated.

I enjoy and can work successfully in a pair, group or as a whole class.
